From Pastor John

As I sit in my office and type this article, I am preparing for our monthly Elders and Deacons meeting. Unlike a lot of pastors across the country, I love these meetings! We have a great group of godly men who are dedicated to the mission and vision of Redding Christian Fellowship. Each month I am reminded of the incredible blessing I have to work with an amazing leadership team.

In some ways, this month's meeting will be like most other months. We'll start with a devotional focused on becoming a more biblical leader. We'll hear what's taking place in the ministries the Deacons oversee. We'll discuss what's taking place in our various ministries. We'll look over the finances of the church. We'll pray for each other and for Redding Christian Fellowship. In all things, we continue to do our best in Helping People Take Their Next Step In Following Jesus.

This month, however, we're also going to spend some time discussing an incredible ministry opportunity and blessing that concerns a chunk of property that RCF was given a few years ago—the property that is on Mistletoe Lane. You may recall that there have been several ideas that have been floated over the years concerning how to use this property. We have either considered or been approached about using the Mistletoe property for two different community organizations, a storage facility, missionary housing, and a couple of other projects. For one reason or another, those ideas never fully took root.

Recently, we were approached by another ministry with which we've had a long-standing relationship—Hope Crisis Response Network. Our church has partnered with them for years as they've helped Middletown rebuild after the fire there several years ago. We've had teams of youth and adults go and have established a great friendship with their leadership, particularly Kevin Cox. After the Carr Fire swept into West Redding this past July, Kevin was in town quickly offering help and wisdom as we thought about how to move forward as individuals and as a

church. Kevin made himself available and helped several RCF families negotiate some tricky waters with decisions in the rebuilding process.

After looking at several different options for housing Hope City (HCRN's base) in Redding that all fell through, Kevin and I met to discuss the possibility of using the Mistletoe property to be the center for their rebuilding efforts. We dreamed about a 6300 square foot storage and garage building that could also be used to house and feed volunteers from across the country. We thought about different options for housing volunteers. After that meeting, the details fell quickly in place—funding was secured from an outside source in 8 hours, Redding City planners gave the green light for what we wanted to do there, and engineering reports were given for free!

The end result of this process is that RCF will be able to partner with Hope City to be a blessing to our community to fulfill our value statement, "We love Redding." We will be an active part of Redding rebuilding after the Carr Fire—and we'll do it in Jesus' name. Hope Crisis Response Network's goal is to be able to rebuild close to 100 homes in the Keswick area, where the largest percentage of uninsured homes were located. While I am very careful to attach God's name to things that we see happening, it seems to me that, perhaps, God was delaying other plans because He knew that a fire would come into Redding and that He could use the people of Redding Christian Fellowship for His purpose's sake.

An additional blessing is that when the work of HCRN is done, we will receive a great storage and garage facility, a need that RCF has had for some time, provided through outside funding and used for an important purpose first. God truly has been amazing through this process and I can't wait to see how He continues to work!

Please continue to pray for your church, our leadership, HCRN, and for Redding as we move forward. Now...off to one of my favorite meetings!

Observations from Pastor Rick

WHY CHRISTIANS SHOULD STOP SAYING "PRAYER WORKS"

One reason people stay away from Christianity is *not* because they don't know any Christians. It's often because they do. Our actions and our words as followers of Jesus have the power to attract or repel people from Christianity. The number of people who never go to church or follow Jesus keeps growing. And their thinking keeps changing.

So what can we do about it? Well, in addition to modeling humility, grace, truth, love and so many other things that describe the earliest Christ followers, we Christians can watch our words.

1 PRAYER WORKS

Should we really stop saying that prayer works? Well, yes and no. Most people who say prayer works these days really mean *God did what I wanted him to do*. As if prayer was a button to be pushed to release exactly what they wanted from the vending machine. Prayer is *not* a button to be pushed; it's a relationship to be pursued. Prayer does 'work,' but it works very differently than we'd like. It still 'works': When we can't trace out any direct result from our prayer.

When the opposite of what we prayed for happens.

In those moments when we feel very distant from God; when we bang down the door of heaven for years and are not sure anything is going on up there at all. There are scores of people inside and outside the church whose spirits are crushed because they prayed (fervently) and: They didn't get the job. Their mom died of cancer. Their child was born without a heartbeat. They ended up in a car crash that left them permanently disabled. Prayer doesn't 'work' because I got what I wanted and they didn't. The parade of saints across the centuries would have been shocked to see prayer reduced to God-doing-what-I-asked-him-to-do-when-I-asked-him-to-do-it. God is not a puppy to be trained or a chef in the kitchen who prepares food to suit our every

whim. He is sovereign. As Richard Foster says: For those explorers in the frontiers of faith, prayer was no little habit tacked on to the periphery of their lives; it was their lives. It was the most serious work of their most productive years. Prayer—nothing draws us closer to the heart of God. Do things happen supernaturally when we pray? Well, yes they do. But often in ways we cannot understand or even trace out. I think Christians can take consolation in the fact that when we pray, we often don't know what to pray for or even how to pray, yet the scriptures tell us the Holy Spirit will translate the prayer into something better than we could phrase in the moment. So pour your heart out to God. Pray about the things the scripture says are close to God's heart. And when something 'goes your way,' be grateful and offer it back to the God who gave it to you. And when things don't go your way, understand that God is still very much in control and very much loves you. Just because God is silent doesn't mean God is absent.

2. GOD TOLD ME TO ...

Often, you hear people (and pastors) say things that start with, "God told me to" The longer I follow Jesus, the more hesitant I am to say God told me to do anything specific. Maybe that's an issue I need to work on, but it springs from my observation that I've seen this misused far more than I've seen it used well or authentically. In fact, I've often noticed that the more outrageous the claim, the more likely someone is to say, "God told me to" When I hear someone claim God told them to do something, I feel like saying: God told you to do that? Really? God himself spoke directly to you and told you to specifically build that building for which you have zero money? Or leave that church that you were in deep conflict with without resolving things? Or buy that house that's way out of your price range? Wow! Are you sure it wasn't the pizza? Or the voice in your head that often tells you to do the things you simply feel like doing? For the record, I believe there are times when God does speak to people today. But let's be realistic. What made me put this phrase on the list is the number of times I have heard the phrase used to describe a decision that is: Selfishly motivated (come on, admit it ... you're justifying your impulses). Contrary to scripture (the scriptures pretty clearly suggest that what you're doing is sinful ... or at least isn't wise). Designed to shut down debate (does anyone really think they can win a "God told me" debate?). I'm not saying God never tells us anything directly, but I am suggesting it happens far less than most of us claim. So what's a better course? Say something like, "Based on what I know from scripture, I believe this is the best/boldest/wisest course of action." That makes sense. And then you can have an intelligent discussion. And you don't pull the God card to justify something about which Christians and others can have a legitimate discussion. Or, if you're just trying to shut down debate, just be honest. I wanted to do it, so I did it. There. Now you said it and everyone will feel better. If you're dead honest, you might even realize you made a crazy decision. TEACHING MISSIONARIES TO CHINA IN OUR OWN BACKYARD

Our church family is active in many ways to help people take their first or next steps in following Jesus. For some time now, Duane and Jeanne Lindner along with Benjamin White and Emma Fay have been meeting weekly with some of the Chinese student pilots here in Redding. This is their story:



It never ceases to amaze me what God can do with a willing spirit and heart. In February 2018, Duane and I, along with Benjamin White, began working with a group of Chinese pilots. Starting out with eight, many fell away leaving us with a solid core of four. Our initial goal was to teach them English using the Bible as a textbook. We have met every Friday night, spending one hour on English and one hour in the book of John. We have watched God, at his best, transform the lives of these four voung men.

To date, none of them have made the commitment to take Jesus as their Savior. However, we have talked about it often enough that when the Lord's time comes for each one of these young men, they will be prepared to make that move. They said from the beginning, what drew them to us (Christians) was the way we loved them, and were faithful to the commitments that we made. We have become a family - both for them and for us. As they are finishing up their training and preparing to go back to China, we are assured that "He who began a good work in them will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." (Phil 1:6) The relationships that we have with these young men will be treasured by us and by them for the rest of our lives. God is so good!
